

Carleton Memorial United Church Jack and Kay Hempstock Scholarship Fund

This Fund was endowed in 1999 and was made possible by a bequest of Katherine Hempstock. Kay Hempstock was a charter member of Carleton Memorial United Church and was Secretary of the Board of Stewards for the first eleven years. In 1966, she became the first of two women members of Session. For many years she was a dedicated and caring Sunday School teacher. Jack Hempstock was the first Secretary of the Official Board. He was also a long-time leader with the "82nd" (Carleton Memorial) Scout Troop.

NUMBER, VALUE and DURATION

Scholarships with a total possible value of \$1,000 each will be awarded annually, when merited. These scholarships are non-renewable; however, students may re-apply in subsequent years.

ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for a scholarship, the applicant must:

- be affiliated with Carleton Memorial United Church

AND one of the following:

- be entering a university to study for the Christian Ministry
- be entering a university to study medicine or science and be in need of financial assistance
- be a post-graduate student studying Christian Ministry, medicine or science in third world countries or doing scientific research in disease control

APPLICATIONS must be submitted by **August 1, 2019** and must include the following:

- a completed application form
- a most recent high school or post-secondary transcript
- an essay of 500 words describing the reasons you would be a worthy recipient of a Jack and Kay Hempstock Scholarship. Include your volunteer activities, most important accomplishments, future educational and career goals and how you plan to finance your education.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

A selection committee consisting of the minister and at least 2 members of Carleton Memorial United Church will meet in July to choose the successful applicants. Each applicants motivation and academic potential will be assessed. All applicants will be notified by the end of August.
